Museum News

THE EATON BEAUTY DOLL (1932)

From 1900 onward, the Eaton Beauty Doll was the object of desire for every Canadian Girl. The Museum is indeed fortunate to have an example of an "Eaton Beauty" doll. Although, over the years the Eaton doll was manufactured by many different companies, an examination of the back of the head identifies this doll as being manufactured by the Armand Marseille Company, Germany. The number 390 is also inscribed, which identifies the doll with respect to size and type. Although the French made dolls reigned supreme from 1870, by 1900 the German doll makers had taken the lead. The Armand Marseilles Company became one of the largest suppliers of dolls in the world. The price of the doll ranged from \$1.00 to \$5.00 depending on size and dress. The doll is 22" tall, has a bisque socket head, jointed composition body (moves legs, knees, ankles, arms, elbows and wrists). She also has "fixed" blue glass eyes and an open mouth showing tiny top teeth. The doll was repaired in 1989 and has a beautiful new wig of auburn ringlets and new shoes. She has a homemade skirt and jacket over what appears to be the original dress. Ruth Strang donated this doll to the Museum.

Feeling like the summer has left you with nothing more to do? Why not pick up a book from your local library and join the Teen Reading Club! The Teen Reading Club is a year-round forum based website that gives students, ages 13-18, the opportunity to connect with other teens across the country with a common interest: books. Teens can discuss their favorite (and least favorite) books on the forums, write reviews about these books, and have the chance to win some awesome prizes for their work. Teens also have the opportunity to submit their original writing to the site for their peers to read and review. Also new this year is the chance to chat with popular authors and take part in a "Mystery Character Chat". The site is completely anonymous in an effort to provide teens with a safe place to discuss their love of reading. Currently there are over 5000 teens signed up for the site who have submitted almost 4000 new books and almost 4000 reviews.

This club started off as an initiative of the BC Libraries, backed by the BC minister of education. Over the past few years, the club has expanded nation-wide and from only a summer reading club to being available year-round. The Chinook Arch Regional library system of Southern Alberta has adopted it enthusiastically and successfully. This summer, there are just over 100 students and moderators signed up for the site and we would dearly love to see that number increase. Each summer a new theme is selected for the site. This year the theme is "Get into Character!"

As well as giving away weekly prizes for the submission of book reviews, each summer, Chinook Arch Regional Library System sponsors a grand prize draw for all teens who have submitted a review over the summer. This year we are giving away an IPOD Touch. The draw will be conducted at the end of the summer on August 27, 2010.

So, the program and prizes sound really great, right? Want to participate? Great! All you need to do is visit www.teenrc.ca and click the big "Join Now" button at the top of your screen. It is a completely free website and totally anonymous. To be eligible to win the awesome prizes we're giving away, start reading books and submitting reviews! There are over twenty five genres of books listed on the site ranging from classics to manga and graphic novels to Goth and vampire; the list of books has something that appeals to everyone.
