Stavely Library Family Membership will increase to \$20/year effective April 1, 2017. \$15 Adult Memberships and \$5 Juvenile Memberships remain the same. A Library Membership gives you access to:

- 3 week's time to lend books every genre with option of 1 renewal
- 1 week to lend DVD movies
- Option to place holds from the other 34 Libraries in Chinook Arch Library System for books or movies not available in Stavely Library
- Holds can be done from the convenience of your own home once you have activated a Pin # at our Library, or you can use the computers in the Library
- Use of all 34 Libraries when visiting out of town
- Wide selection of popular Adult Magazines for a 3 week loan period
- E-books can be downloaded and ordered from the Library or from home
- You can return all books or movies from other Chinook Arch Libraries in our drop bin or in the Library during Library hours
- Inter Library loans made available for books not available in our region
- Rent our projector at a nominal fee of \$30.00

2017 SPRING Cleanup Program

Spring is just around the corner and we want to help make it easier for you get rid of unnecessary household items and help make



Stavely a clean, beautiful, clutter free town. Every Tuesday for the month of April Public works will pick up general and construction waste in addition to regular garbage—items for this pick up may be set out on Mondays. **PLEASE NOTE**—every effort will be made to have non household garbage items picked up on the Tuesday but items may not be picked up until later in the week.

Acceptable Items:

Furniture—couches, dressers, desks, chairs, tables
Appliances—dryers, washers, toasters, refrigerators, freezers, a/c units. (a fee will apply to any appliance containing Freon)

Metals

“Other” or construction waste (should be no more than 75 lbs and no longer than 6’ to accommodate the Town garbage truck)

Non-acceptable items: Organic waste, toxic waste and electronics

Electronics are still accepted and can be placed in the bin located next to the recycling bin trailer. Tree branches and compostable material should be taken to the area east of Town near the lagoon. For toxic waste be sure to utilize the annual toxic waste roundup—watch for dates in the local newspaper.

Please ensure all items set out for pick up are separated and are in neat piles next to your regular garbage. Thank you in advance to all those who choose to participate and help to clean up Stavely. **NOTE:** if you are not sure if an item is approved to be picked up or if you have other general questions please contact the Town Office at 403-549-3761 or the Town Shop at 403-549-3944.
