Family Memberships will increase to \$20/year effective April 1st. Adult Memberships will remain at \$15/year and Juvenile Memberships will remain at \$5/year. A Library Membership gives you access to:

- Option to place holds from the 34 other Libraries in Chinook Arch Library System for books or movies not available in Stavelly
- Holds can be done from the convenience of your own home once you have activated a Pin # at our Library, or you can use the computers in the Library

- Wide selection of popular Adult Magazines for a 3 week loan period

- You can return all books or movies from other Chinook Arch Libraries in our drop bin or in the Library during Library hours
- Inter Library Loans made available for books not available in our Region
- Rent our projector at a nominal fee of \$30.00
