The Stavely United Church building is now officially the property of the Stavely Museum. It is no longer a United Church of Canada. The Museum will be using part of the building for storage, however, it has been agreed that the Sanctuary will remain untouched. It is a unique part of our history, and with the beautiful old stained glass windows, original pews and other furnishings it is still a lovely, welcoming space. Our plan is to use the Sanctuary as a small Wedding Chapel—you may have noticed the new sign. We are working on getting information out to making this happen and hope that the money realized can be used to pay the utilities and any required upkeep on this historic little building.

Town of Stavely News

Town Council recently passed a bylaw amendment to the Town's Business License Bylaw to regulate and control garage sales.



Going forward residents will be permitted to hold a maximum of three garage sales (weekends) on a yearly basis and a \$10.00 permit fee per garage sale is now applicable. If a resident should wish to have more than three garage sales a development permit for a home occupation will be needed.

It is requested that no advertising be placed on power or light poles or on Town property. Any signage that is put up must be removed immediately after any garage sale.

Zinio for Libraries Mobile App Migration to RBDigital

Nearly 60% of Zinio for Libraries app patrons have already migrated to the RBDigital app, which provides access to magazines and other types of content to which your Library subscribes. To provide enough time for the other 40% of patrons to migrate, patrons will be able to access all of the functions of the Zinio for Libraries app until December 11, 2017. At that time, the Zinio for Libraries app will be locked for each patron. The app will still be available but will display the following message: *Zinio for Libraries has merged with RBDigital. To access your magazine collection, please download the new RBDigital app now by clicking here.* **Note: Your username and password will remain the same.**

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PURSUANT to sections 230, 606 and 692 of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26, 2000 as amended, the Council of the Town of Stavely in the Province of Alberta hereby gives notice of its intention to amend Bylaw No. 769, being the Land Use Bylaw.

WHEREAS the Town of Stavely desires to amend the land use designation of lands legally described as:

Lot 1, Block 5 Plan 1711676;

WHEREAS shown on Schedule 'A' attached hereto, from "Urban Reserve - UR" to "Industrial - IN" and "Public Institutional - PI";

WHEREAS the Council has determined that the "Industrial - IN" designation is appropriate for the lands and further that "Public Institutional - PI" is appropriate as a buffer from future residential and Highway 2;

AND WHEREAS the purpose of the proposed amendment is to expand the industrial park;


