Library News

Book Club

We will resume our monthly meetings in September, starting on September 7th at 7:00 pm in the Library. This month, we have a choice of two books to read called "The Zookeeper's Wife" by Diane Ackerman and "The Nest" by Cynthia D'Aprix Sweeney. You can research both these books on the Stavely Library Website. Please feel free to come by the Library to pick up your copy. Everyone is welcome to participate and we welcome suggestions for future book club reads.

The Stavely Library has been looking for ways to rally the community for support. One of the most effective tools is a Friends of the Library group. These groups are in most towns including Claresholm and Vulcan. Because library funding falls under the municipality, the Library Board does not qualify for casinos or certain grants. The Friends group becomes a way to raise funds, supply volunteers, raise awareness, etc. In order to form a Friends group in Stavely the first step would be to gather as many interested people as possible to form a steering committee. If you are interested in keeping our Library sustainable, with an up to date selection of books and DVD movies, please plan to attend our Library Board Meeting scheduled for Thursday, September 14th at 7:00 pm in the Library. A guest speaker will be attending to provide more information and answer questions you may have.

SOLARO is a homework help tool based on the Alberta curriculum. It offers study help and exam prep for grades 3 to 12, and is great for preparing students for back to school and preventing the summer slide. Library patrons can create an account, work through course lessons, reviews, and quizzes, and improve their grades. SOLARO can also be accessed on mobile devices, with apps for Apple and Android.

- **Wired** by Julie Garwood—A beautiful computer hacker and a bad -boy FBI agent must collaborate—in more ways than one.
- **A Matter of Trust (Montana Rescue #3)** by Susan May Warren—readers are taken on a wild, death-defying adventure through the snowy peaks of Montana. The Montana Rescue series centers around a heroic team of search and rescue members.

FEATURED DVD MOVIES

- **The Founder**—The Founder puts Michael Keaton's magnetic performance at the center of a smart, satisfying biopic that traces the rise of one of America's most influential businessmen—and the birth of one of its most far-reaching industries.
- **The Zookeeper's Wife**—The real-life story of one working wife and mother who became a hero to hundreds during World War II. September 2017—Prostate Cancer Awareness Month



Prostate Cancer Canada is the leading national foundation dedicated to the elimination of the most common cancer in men through research, advocacy, education, support and awareness. For 22 years, we have invested the generous donations of Canadians towards funding research that will uncover better diagnostic and treatment options, and towards providing comprehensive education and support services for those living with and affected by prostate cancer.

Prostate Cancer facts

- 1 in 7 Canadian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime
- An estimated 21,300 Canadian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2017
- An estimated 4,100 Canadian men will die of prostate cancer in 2017

Early detection saves lives. When detected early, the survival rate for prostate cancer is over 90%. This is why awareness is so important. Prostate Cancer Canada (PCC) encourages men to initiate a shared decision-making process with their doctors around age 40 to discuss their personal risk as well as the harms and benefits of the prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test. That way, men will be better equipped to decide upon an early detection strategy that is right for them. Over the last 20 years, the mortality rate from prostate cancer has been reduced by approximately 40% due to advancements in early diagnosis and treatment.
