Clr. Whittingham-

Museum Secretary/Treasurer resigned at last meeting however Dacia Sundquist has stepped in to take this role on. Golf Course meeting they are replacing 3 artificial greens and questions about how to get a MD of willow creek truck to be able to take material to the dump. Councilor Gugala suggested contacting Brian Nelson the MD Councilor for this area to take to the MD Council.

Clr. Norby- Attended Landfill meeting everything running normal.

Clr. Martin- Ag Society Meeting the Road Hammers are coming for a summer concert.

Clr. Varey- Nothing to report.

Clr. Binmore-

Youth Hall a little slower with the summer months. They are looking to do some repairs while it's slow. PPHL — in discussions with engineering company on what the new housing will look like. No funding in place yet just in the preliminary stages.

Clr. Gugala- Nothing to report

Foreman Watson-

- 1) Paving update: So the paving has been completed with the designated areas. There was one isolation valve that was not paved, and the reason is that we are still having problems working the valve. We believe there is a rock causing some problems, and that we might have to vac it out. Regarding 52nd street, the paving company could do some over lays where there is water services, but then that would mean there is still a bump in that area. No real way to solve that problem unless the whole street is re paved. (big project)
- 2) We have been using the broom and power pack with the New Holland tractor. There was a break down with the power pack, and waiting for some parts. (wire had broke off, stopped the cooling fan, and caused the unit to over heat)
- 3) Street sweeper: we do have some hydraulic line and hydraulic ram problems with this unit. Will give an update at another meeting on what it might look like to repair.
- 4) Water plant generator had to run for about 4 hours on Sunday, which is the longest it has run except for annual maintenance/testing day. We do a test once per month, but it runs for about 45 min. So with the extended power outage we also had the water well down. We do have a transfer switch in place at the well, but no connections are available, and no agreement for mobile power supply. This can be researched in the coming months.
